

National Opinion Poll Governance & Elections January 18th, 2023 Report Summary UPDATED



Executive Summary

EXECTUIVE SUMMARY



- Latest national poll conducted by Global InfoAnalytics between 31st December 2022 and 15th January 2023, shows the race to lead the NPP is a dead heat among NPP voters as Dr Mahamudu Bawumia (DMB) loses his slender lead he enjoyed in October 2022 over Alan Kwadwo Kyeremanten (AKK). The poll now shows DMB and AKK levelled at 40% apiece among NPP voters. However, among general voters, AKK's lead over DBM has been cut to 41% to 32% compared to 44% to 31% in October 2022. Kennedy Ohene Agyapong (KOA) is in third place with 14% of the votes.
- In the race to lead the NDC, the poll shows John Dramani Mahama (JDM) extending his lead over Dr Kwabena Dufuor (DKD) as he is now backed by 77% of voters compared to 13% for DKD. However, among NDC voters, JDM attracts 94% and DKD 4%.
- In the 2024 general election head-to-head between DMB and JDM, the poll shows a tightening race as DMB cuts JDM lead from 62% in October 2022 to 58% in January 2023. JDM now leads 58% to 36%, a 3% point improvement for DMB compared to the previous poll.
- □ In the race between JDM and AKK, JDM now leads AKK 57% to 39%. JDM led AKK 60% to 36% in the October 2022 poll, representing a slide of 3% point for JDM in the latest poll.

- □ However, in a head-to-head between JDM and Kennedy Ohene Agyapong (KOA), JDM leads the Assin North legislator 63% to 31%.
- On the question of whether the NPP can "break-the-eight", 24% of voters believed the party can "break-the-eight" whilst 59% said they can't and 17% had no opinion.
- □ The poll shows the president's job approval rating making significant recovery his approval rating, from 26% in October, leaping to 32% in January 2023, whilst his disapproval declined sharply from 69% in October to 59% in January 2023. For the vice president, he enjoys 32% approval and 58% disapproval. In the case of AKK, 35% of voters approved of his performance as trade and industry minister whilst 45% disapprove his performance.
- □ On the question of direction of the country, only 18% said it is headed in the right direction compared to 71% who believed it is headed in the wrong direction.



Methodology & Approach

Methodology and Approach:

□Sample size: 5,844

Confidence level: 99% and MoE of 1.74%

□ The sample size was allocated to all the regions based on total number of voters in each of the regions as per the EC 2020 register.



□ A random selection of 30% of constituencies from each region was then selected and allocated the regional quota based on total voters in each of those constituencies.

□ Respondents were selected randomly in the streets, homes and workplaces.

□Party affiliation is defined as the party the voter usually votes for, or in the case of firsttime voters, the party they intend to vote for. Floating voters are voters who vote different political parties over several election cycles or does not align him/herself to any of the registered political parties

□ Field interviews were conducted between 31st December and 15th January 2023

The results of the primaries and general elections head-to-head are based on "likely voters" model which exclude responses of voters who have indicated they will not in the primaries and presidential elections.

The poll is a cross-sectional survey






President's Job Approval – Party Affiliation





How do you describe your standard of living in the last 12 months








State of Corruption




Who to Lead NPP – NPP Voters only

NPP Primaries – Runoff DMB v AKK














Splitting KOA votes in DMB v AKK Runoff






Who to Lead NDC- All Voters










DMB v JDM - Party Affiliations




DMB v JDM – Religious Votes







Top Six Issues – DBM v JDM








